The 2010 census is upon us. If you have not sent in your census form you can expect a visit from a census worker in the coming weeks. The following is copied from the 2010 census gov website.

Do I have to talk to the census taker? Yes. Your participation in the 2010 Census is vital and required by law, (Section 221, of Title 13 of the U.S. Code). Census workers may need to visit your household to update the Census Bureau's address list, deliver a questionnaire or ask you to complete the questionnaire face-to-face. All census workers carry official government badges marked with just their name. You also may ask them for a picture ID from another source to confirm their identity. In addition, some census workers might carry a 'U.S. Census Workers' bag. If you still are not certain about their identity, please call the Regional Census Center (404-335-1555) to confirm that they are employed by the Census Bureau.

Please be informed about the questions the official census workers will ask and the identification they should have in order to protect yourself from those who may come to your house posing as a census worker.


As always, please be aware of new neighbors in your immediate area and welcome them to our community by introducing yourself and also by letting us know they are here so that we, too, can welcome them.

Industry of the Month: Insurance Providers BBB® examines industries with most activity in 2009

Pensacola, Fla. (April 21, 2010) – As hurricane season approaches, your Better Business Bureau focuses on insurance providers. As an industry, insurance businesses were in the top 25 industries with inquiries to BBB/ Northwest Florida.

Your BBB/Northwest Florida is focusing on the industries that had the most activity last year and plans to highlight one each month in 2010. BBB hopes to proactively provide the information that consumers seek from BBB as the leader in advancing marketplace trust.

When looking for a trustworthy insurance provider, BBB urges consumers to take the following precautions:

Choose the right policy: Study your needs. Determine the factors that are most important to you as well as the risks that would be a damaging issue.

Choose the right provider: If you're not searching for a specialty insurance policy, be sure you limit your search to mainstream businesses that don't specialize in smaller niche markets to ensure an affordable policy.

Research the provider you are considering: Most states have records of how insurance providers deal with past customers. Start with bbb.org to get a free BBB Reliability Report on specific businesses and in Florida, check with the Department of Financial Services (www.myfloridacfo.com or 877-My-FL-CFO) which regulates insurance providers in Florida. Businesses that have repeated problems should be marked off your list because cheap insurance policies that cause problems are not worth the hassle when you need to make a claim.

Read all quotes and information carefully: Most providers will be up-front with you about policies. However, some may seem more affordable than others because of their thin coverage. Compare the quotes you receive as they might not have the same coverage or deductible. Certain businesses can appear cheaper at first, but prove to be a headache long-term.

Compare quotes not price: When comparing various quotes, be aware that price isn't necessarily the primary objective. You ideally want to work with a business that has many years experience in the field. Look for a business that can assign you a representative at the firm who works with you from the get-go to create a policy to meet your needs.

Do your homework: Talk to your neighbors for recommendations. Contact your BBB for a free list of all BBB Accredited insurance providers or for a free BBB Reliability Report on a specific business.

Car & Home Burglary Prevention Tips

Car

- Lock your car door & close your windows when parked. This simple act is proven to keep thieves out. Most of the car burglaries in Okaloosa County are from people simply not locking up.
- Remove 'pull-out' style radio face plates (if equipped).
- Park in well lit areas when possible.
- Park where your car will be easily & frequently viewed (natural surveillance).
- Park in your garage if you have one.
- Use a car alarm, it will alert anyone nearby.
- Keep all valuables out of sight. Do not leave your personal belongings in plain sight in your vehicle. Items in your car such as shopping bags, purse, wallet, GPS, CD's, jewelry and/or other valuables should be removed or placed in the trunk when parked, especially overnight. Do not leave your keys in your vehicle! Car thefts in Okaloosa County have occurred because people left their car keys in the car.
- Check items in your vehicle. Do not have your home address saved as "Home" in your GPS. If you do, you have now given criminals "Turn by Turn" directions to your home. Also, leaving your garage door opener in your unlocked vehicle gives criminals access to most homes.

Home

- Use your home alarm system.
- If you plan to travel for the holidays, call the **Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office non-emergency number 651-7400** and have a watch order placed on your home.
- Also, you can ask a trusted friend or neighbor to keep an eye on your home.
- Keep all doors locked and windows closed.
- Make sure all bushes and trees are cut back.
- If someone unknown knocks on the door and seems suspicious, do not open the door! Call law enforcement!!


