OCSO DEPUTIES SOLVE RASH OF NORTH OKALOOSA CAR BURGLARIES

Two teenagers face more than a dozen counts of burglary, grand theft, and/or theft in connection with a large number of car burglaries that took place in and around the Silver Oaks subdivision area near Crestview.

On September 19th, deputies responding to calls of multiple car break-ins spotted two teens running into a field between Old Bethel Road and Kingston Roads. One was stopped immediately and the other was found a short time later hiding behind a tree. The teens, 17-year old Tyler Monroe Simmons of 5258 Lowell Mason Road in Crestview and 16-year old Zachary Ryan Packard of 1330 16th St. in Baker, had carry packs containing large amounts of stolen property.

Packard told deputies the pair had been working all evening breaking into <u>unlocked</u> cars. They're believed responsible for at least fifteen car burglaries.

Stolen items ranged from a firearm and prescription medicines to wallets and electronic items.
